# **Math Vocabulary**

- **Place Value**—the value of a digit based on its position in a number. For example, in the number 9,456, four is in the hundreds place and has a value of 400.
- Standard Form—a way of writing a number as a sum of the values of its digits.

**Example: 9,456** 

• **Expanded Form**—a way of writing numbers using the digits 0-9 with each digit having a place value Example: 9,000 + 400 + 50 + 6

• Word Form—a way of writing numbers using words Example: nine thousand, four hundred fifty-six
