1. **boulders**: large, rounded rocks
2. **canyon**: a deep valley with steep walls on both sides formed by running water.
3. **cauldron**: a large pot used for boiling
4. **ledges**: flat spaces liked shelves on the sides of cliffs or rock walls
5. **rapids**: a group of small waterfalls in a river where the water flows very fast.
6. **scouted**: observed or explored carefully for information
7. **sheer**: very steep
8. **cause**: is the event that makes something else happen (Why does something happen?)
9. **effect**: is the event that happens as a result of the cause (What happens?)
10. **souvenir**: something kept as a reminder of a special place or event.
11. **scrawny**: thin and bony; skinny

- Add s to for the plural of most singular nouns
- Add es to form the plural of singular nouns that end in s, sh, ch, or z.
- To form the plural of nouns ending in a consonant and y, change the y to i and add es.
- To form the plural of nouns ending in a vowel and y just add s.
- To form the plural of nouns ending in f or fe, change the f or fe to v and add es.
- Some nouns have special plural forms: child-children; man—men; tooth-teeth
- A few nouns have the same singular and plural form: Ex. deer, sheep, moose
